

We have our AA friends scheduled to come and help us with the physical move on Saturday, Sep. 9 at 10am. We must have the hall completely cleaned out that day. If you are able, please plan on helping box up the good stuff and throw out that which is broken or no longer needed.
- 4. Groups who use the Fellowship Hall will be displaced to the main building and schedules have been worked out. These displacements are expected to last 6-8 weeks.
